Bellevue Technology Center Update

Once again this year, SFCC board and community members actively participated in a new effort to oppose an application that would have removed development restrictions on the BTC site. On January 30th, exactly one year after the previous application, the real estate company that owns the BTC campus filed another application with City of Bellevue to change the policy in the Bellevue Comprehensive Plan regarding the BTC parcel. This was the 3rd application in the last 5 years.

SFCC once again joined other Northeast Bellevue communities to create a well organized and informed group that drove the opposition to the application and presented evidence and arguments at different public hearings and met with city council members throughout the year. SFCC members participated on these public hearings and signed a new petition that collected more than 2,400 signatures from Bellevue residents.

Once again the interests of NE residents prevailed and on June 10th the application for Comprehensive Plan Amendment for the Bellevue Technology Center site was withdrawn after the applicants realized the CoB Planning Commission was not going to approve their application.

This victory would not have been possible without the work from SFCC residents and block reps. Your participation sent a clear message to the city indicating the importance of the site and the value that our community places on the green and open space.

We continue to engage with the City of Bellevue and we are now asking the planning commission and city council to change the rules that have permitted the BTC lawyers to apply and withdraw the request at the last minute. The city of Bellevue will be having another public hearing On October 23rd, were we will be joining forces with other Northeast Bellevue neighborhoods to expose the need to close the loophole that has allowed yearly applications to BTC. Once again we hope you can join us and show to the city that this is a very important topic for our community.

<u>Block Watch</u> Develop and implement, block-by-block, the City of Bellevue Block Watch program to promote residential awareness, safety, and security.

<u>Communications</u> Develop and maintain an electronic communication system. Help with publication of Quarterly SFCC newsletters and any other community materials.

<u>Emergency Preparedness</u> Develop and implement a block-by-block preparedness program to address impacts from severe storms, earthquakes, and other disaster.

<u>Land Use</u> Monitor Bellevue and Redmond land use development proposals affecting the Sherwood Forest neighborhood. Have contact with City of Bellevue officials on Land Use. Be involved with City of Bellevue Land Use events, send summary of event back to SFCC Board

<u>Neighborhood Enhancement</u> Monitor the Bellevue Neighborhood Enhancement program, including announcements and proposals for NE Bellevue from City of Bellevue. Solicit feedback from residents and other means such as social media, email etc, on enhancements to the neighborhood

<u>Traffic & Transportation Committee</u> Monitor Bellevue and Redmond transportation plans, proposals, and projects with the potential to impact the SF Neighborhood.
