TREE PRESERVATION IN SHERWOOD FOREST

The City of Bellevue recently enacted an interim tree ordinance. A permit is now required for the removal of any landmark tree (at least 24" in diameter / 75" in circumference, measured four feet above grade and at least 20' tall.) For more information visit the City's website: https://bellevuewa.gov/city-government/departments/development/zoning-and-land-use/zoning-requirements/trees/tree-removal.

FALL MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

- Check or Replace batteries in smoke detectors.
- Replace furnace/AC filters.
- Check the heating system, chimney, and fireplace.
- Clean gutters and downspouts.
- Inspect windows, doors, weatherstripping, and trim.
- Inspect the insulation and ventilation.
- Landscape the yard and prune as needed.
- Fertilize and aerate your lawn to prepare for next year.
- Overseed the lawn and attack perennial weeds.
- Clean and pressure wash walkways and driveways.
- Seal the deck, fix gates, and store or cover outdoor furniture and equipment.
- Repair any drainage issues.
- Winterize your sprinkler system
